OVERVIEW

The HAF program was designed to assist homeowners who were experiencing financial difficulties because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

PURPOSE

It aimed to prevent mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosures, and displacement, as well as tax delinquency in property taxes. Additionally, the program provided utility assistance for those who were struggling with high past due amounts due to the consequences of COVID-19.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This program specifically targeted economically vulnerable and traditionally underserved homeowners.
